

Instructions for arrival

Life Science Center is located at Keilaranta 10–18. It's easy to reach by public transport, your own car or bike. All buildings from 10-18 are connected with an open internal corridor which makes access easy regardless of where you enter.

Parking

There are limited spaces reserved for guests in the parking lot of the Life Science Center, so please be prepared to arrive in good time. In the Keilaniemi area, you may also find parking at P-Keilaniemi 3 starting March 3rd 2025: <https://www.europark.fi/pysakointi/p-keilaranta-3/>

Parking in the Life Science Center's visitor spaces is subject to a fee between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. It is possible to pay for parking using the [Moovy](#), [Easypark](#) and [ParkMan](#) phone applications or, alternatively, by paying for parking later on Moovy's website (www.moovy.fi/maksa) no later than 48 hours after the parking event. As you exit the parking area, there are screens displaying whether or not you have paid for your parking. If your parking is not paid for, it is easy to do so on Moovy's website.

Metro ([schedule](#))

Both metro lines M1 (Kivenlahti-Vuosaari) and M2 (Tapiola-Mellunmäki) stop at Keilaniemi metro station, from where it is a two-minute walk to the Keilaranta 18 entrance of the Life Science Center.

The entrance at Keilaranta 18 is directly next to the Raide-Jokeri end station. Most map applications do not display this information yet and will guide people arriving from the Metro to walk around to the Keilaranta 10 entrance.

Bus ([schedule](#))

Line 52 and main lines 550 and 510 move through Keilaranta, Kuusisaarentie and Otaniementie, and the distance to the nearest Otanimensilta stop is two minutes from Keilaranta 10 entrance. Other nearby stops are Keilaniemi (M) and Otaranta.

Raide-Jokeri / Light Rail line ([aikataulu](#))

The Keilaniemi end station of Raide-Jokeri, or Light Rail Line 15, is located directly in front of the Keilaranta 18 entrance of the Life Science Center. The Raide-Jokeri departs every 8 minutes and takes an estimated 15 minutes from Leppävaara.
